📣 Ahoy, All Classic and Wooden Boat Enthusiasts!!

It's **SHOW TIME** --Let's bring out those antique and classic vessels you've labored over, polishing and restoring for the past year! The Mid-Atlantic Chapter of A.C.B.S. and the NJ Museum of Boating invite both ACBS members and non-members to join us on Saturday, September 16, 2023, 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. (rain date Sept. 17) at **Johnson Brothers Boat Works**, 1800 Bay Ave., Pt. Pleasant, NJ.

🚤 **LOCATION:** Show Headquarters and Registration is at the ACBS tent outside Building #12, across from the Swim Club. Docking is in the main basin near the travel lifts and along the bulkhead by the road. No water or electric hookups are available. Bring lines and fenders. Look for the Dock Masters (orange vests) who will assign your location on land or in the water. On-land trailered displays may enter from Bay Ave or West Lake Ave. By water, use the northbound entrance channel just west of the Bay Head Yacht Club, turn left at the end of the channel by the Houseboats and go west to the Service Yard inner basin.

🚤 **REGISTRATION & JUDGING:** Boats should arrive Friday afternoon or very early Saturday morning between 7:30 and 8:30 A.M., with registration completed by 9:00 A.M. **Sign in as soon as you arrive for your registration credentials.** Judging begins 9:30 A.M. and will use the NEW TOURING CLASS criteria. **PRE-REGISTRATION IS A MUST** especially for water docking, as space is limited. **All boats, including DISPLAY BOATS, MUST BE REGISTERED.** This is NOT a brokerage show, and "FOR SALE" signs on boats are discouraged. For those who received registration by mail, please complete and return the attached Registration Form with payment A.S.A.P. to the above address to assure a spot. For those who received registration by email, you may either register on-line, or print and return your registration by mail. In either case, mail your check to the above address. For your reference, Judging Class boat descriptions are included on a separate page with the enclosed Registration Form. "DISPLAY ONLY" BOATS WILL NOT BE JUDGED.

🚤 **FEATURES:** Our show this year includes antique and classic boats, Classic American cars, radio controlled boats, nautical theme vendors, the New Jersey Museum of Boating, the Vintage Auto Museum, and much more. Food service is available, on site, all day.

Our Mid-Atlantic ACBS Chapter and NJMB members and all boating enthusiasts look forward to seeing your antique (pre 1942), classic (1943-1976), replica/contemporary (after 1977) wooden boats, or your "classic non-wood" boat (pre 1998). JUDGING CLASSES

POWERED CLASSES

- **CRUISER** – a powered enclosed cabin vessel designed for and equipped with extended live-aboard facilities.
- **COMMUTER** – an inboard powered boat designed for speed; primarily built to transport its owner and guests to and from home or work, with minimal overnight accommodations, if any, and should have an enclosed cabin.
- **DISPRO** – a boat designed for and equipped with a “disappearing propeller” propulsion system
- **LAUNCH** – a general purpose open cockpit boat, usually of round bilge design, non-planing hull form.
- **OUTBOARD** – a boat powered by an outboard motor.
- **RACER** – an inboard or outboard powered boat of planing or semi-planing hull form, designed and used primarily for racing competition.
- **RUNABOUT** – a boat designed with one (1) or more closed cockpit(s) and the engine(s) under a deck.
- **SAILBOAT w/AUX** – a sailing vessel with a permanently mounted auxiliary propulsion system.
- **SPORT FISH/SEA SKIFF** – a powered vessel designed for and equipped with limited live-aboard facilities; primarily intended and outfitted for fishing.
- **STEAM/NAPHTHA** – a boat with either a steam or naphtha propulsion system.
- **UTILITY** – a general purpose open cockpit, normally with the engine mounted amidships under an engine box.
- **WORK BOAT** – a vessel whose primary design and function is commercial operations.
- **YACHT TENDER** – a boat used for carrying supplies and/or passengers to and from a larger vessel.

NON-POWERED CLASSES

- **ADIRONDACK GUIDEBOAT** – an open paddling or rowing boat designed to be carried (portaged), with lightweight hull form and design which evolved in the Adirondack region.
- **PADDLING CANOE** – a canoe designed primarily for paddle propulsion.
- **ROWING SKIFF** – normally a double ended open row boat whose design evolved from the canoe.
- **SAIL w/o AUX** – a non-canoe vessel designed for and propelled by sails. (NOTE: may have provision for temporary aux. power.)
- **SAILING CANOE – DECKED** – a canoe designed primarily for sail propulsion and fully decked fore and aft. Normally used for racing.
- **SAILING CANOE – OPEN** – a canoe designed primarily for sail propulsion with no or minimal decking. Normally used for cruising.
- **SAILING SKIFF** – normally a double ended sail boat whose design evolved from the canoe.
- **SCULL** – a lightweight, special design rowing craft with sliding seat and having very long and narrow hull with minimal freeboard. A scull can also be a dingy-type boat propelled by a single sculling oar.
- **ROWBOAT, TENDER, DINGY, SHARPIE, PRAM, DORY, ETC.** – a general class encompassing all craft normally propelled by oars and not elsewhere classified.

F.Y.I.: HISTORIC – a boat built up to and including 1918.

ANITQUE – a boat built between 1919 and 1942 inclusive.

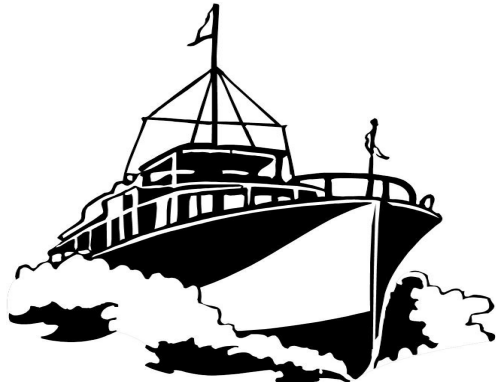
CLASSIC – a boat built between 1943 and 1976 inclusive.

LATE CLASSIC – a boat built between 1977 and 1992.

CONTEMPORARY – any wooden boat built after 1993.

REPLICA – a wooden boat built in a non-production manner, intended to be one-of-a-kind, and usually an exact copy or duplicate of a boat previously built or manufactured.

CLASSIC NON-WOOD – a boat usually fiberglass, but not limited to, built 1997 or earlier.
